Durham Public Schools Summer Program

DPS Provides day camps that combine enrichment activities with traditional recreational opportunities. Sports, games, swimming, field trips and crafts combine with interesting learning themes. All activities are included in the fee. All of Durham Public Schools' Summer Camps are licensed by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services Division of Child Development.

<u>Durham Parks & Recreation Summer Camp options</u>

- Registration begins March 18th and is available at any Durham Parks and Rec Site. Online
 registration is available 24 hours a day (see website below). The most popular camps fill up
 in the first day or two of registration, others fill up by April or May.

- Camps operate from 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- Ages 5-12 (teen camps available for 13-17)
- Day camp Fees:
 - \$25 per week due at registration (subject to change)
 - City Residents with Play More Card: \$118.75 per child per week.
 - City Residents without Play More Card: \$ 132 per child per week.
 - Non-city Residents with Play More Card: \$141.25
 - Non-city Residents without Play More Card: \$157
 - Sliding Fee Scale Application (can only be applied to fee for Summer Program):
 - Has to be processed before signing up for Summer Camp. Processing can take up to a few weeks.
 - Is based on income and eligibility
 - Can be printed off from website <u>www.dprplaymore.org/394</u> and filled out by hand or obtained from office **400 Cleveland St. Durham, NC**
 - You can either fax, mail, or bring application to agency in person



Durham Arts Council

- Registration is currently open online, www.durhamarts.org, by phone at 919-560-2726, or in person at 120 Morris St.
- Offers a variety of activities from June 17 August 9, 2019 for <u>children age 5-13</u> –camps focus on art, music and cultural themes.
- They offer daily, weekly or multi-week camps. Daily half-day camps run from 9-3 or 3-5:30 (drop-off begins at 8am).
- Scholarships are available based on financial need. To apply fill out the application and send it to Durham Arts Council School, 120 Morris Street, Durham, NC 27701.
- If you need assistance in completing this application, call the DAC School (919) 560-2726
- Fees:
 - o Daily Camps (9 am- 3pm is \$40 per day)(3pm- 5:30 pm is \$17 per day)
 - One and two week mini camps: (\$180 for 1 week) (\$360 for 2 weeks)
 - June 17th-June 28th (Session A cultural camp)--- \$360 if 9am-3pm/ \$140 if 3pm-5:30pm July 8th-July 12th (Session B cultural camp)--\$180 for 9am-3pm/ \$70 for 3pm-5:30pm July 15th-July 26th (Session C)-- \$360 if 9am-3pm/ \$140 if 3pm-5:30pm July 29th-August 9th (Session D) -- \$360 if 9am-3pm/ \$140 if 3pm-5:30pm

Durham Arts Council awards scholarships on the basis of financial need. Scholarships are awarded through a formal application process, and DAC offers scholarships to children and teens for either 75% or 50% of the cost of the camp. The awards are made based upon the financial need of the child/teen's family. A scholarship application can be obtained by calling Janet Bell. It should be completed and attached to the camp registration form. - If you are accepted off the waiting list, there is a one-time **Deposit/Registration Fee** required to secure your child's spot: \$50 for 1st child, \$45 for each additional child. If they are not yet Club members, you will need to pay the \$10 annual membership fee. The weekly fee for attendance will be \$60 in addition to the Deposit/Registration Fee.



• **Scholarship application** will be made available on **March 1, 2019** and can be submitted between then and **March 22, 2019**. Application can be found on their website.

Please note: Field trips will be frequent throughout the summer. If there is a cost associated with any field trip in particular, that cost will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to provide.
